Principal's Corner

On May 30, 1911 Ray Harroun won the inaugural Indianapolis 500, averaging 74.6mph in his car the Marmon Wasp. The Indy 500 was the creation of Carl Fisher. In the fall of 1909, Fisher replaced the ruined, crushed-stone surface of his 2.5-mile oval with a brand-new brick one. It was the largest paved, banked oval in the United States. Fisher then made two decisions vital to the success of the Indy 500. First, he determined to hold only one race per year on his Indianapolis Motor Speedway; second, he elected to offer the richest purse in racing as a reward for competing in his annual 500-mile event.

Please be aware that your student is in need of further vaccines before the start of school on August 26! 6th grade students will need Tdap (a dose of tetanus, diphtheria, and acellular pertussis vaccine) and a second dose of the varicella (chickenpox) vaccine. Kindergarten students will need a second dose of the varicella (chickenpox) vaccine. Please be sure to have your child immunized before the first day of school, August 26, 2008.

Ink Cartridge Update! Unfortunately, the ink cartridge program that Staples and Office Max offers has changed. Office Max and Staples will only accept ink cartridges that are DELL, LEXMARK and HP. Please continue to donate these three types of ink cartridges.

Important change and request! It has been brought to our attention that the state of Wisconsin prohibits copying of all vital records. That means we cannot accept photocopied birth certificates of your child. We also will not accept baptismal certificates as proof of birth. As enrollment approaches for next school year, please take the time to locate your child's original birth certificate. If you do not have one, you will need to take care of this. We require all original birth certificates to be presented at time of enrollment. I realize they are expensive. We do not need to keep them. A form will be filled out in your presence and the original certificate will be returned to you.
